The smaller campground is on the other side of the Yellow River. Fishermen love it! You can walk from your camper or tent to the river a few feet away.


It's lovely, quiet and more primitive.

We have a beautiful facility for trail rides, clinics, events, and horse clubs. We have access to many DNR trails as well as our own. River crossings, grassy mown trails through forests and glades – it is very peaceful.

Rainbow Trout, Brown Trout & Smallmouth Bass can rip the line off your reel and get your heart humping. You'll settle into the quiet serenity of the Yellow River as you float or wade, casting your fly into a pool or eddy below the white water rapids. Surrounded by overhanging Willows and towering Cottonwoods on a long stretch of quiet water your mind is at peace. Suddenly on your right, a bank of cool air floats toward you and a dark shady vertical limestone bluff towers above and descends into the river. The vertical rock wall is like a fairy tail scene come true with ferns, mosses, lichens and wildflowers covering the wet dripping rock. You stop and cast a dry fly along the edge of the deep clear water cut and watch as a huge Brown Trout inhales the tiny fly.

Mississippi Nearby the Mississippi awaits River you and lures you into the heart of the some of the best backwater fishing in America.

Nestled between the steep bluffs of lowa and Wisconsin, you slowly and quietly maneuver into a backwater lake covered with water lilies. Your first



pad and as it hits the water, there is a sudden explosion of a 4 lb. Largemouth Bass that has been fooled by your look alike frog. Later in the day under a willow in a maze of backwater sloughs, you loose track of where you are but you don't care because your family is having fun pulling Bluegills and Crappies into the boat. Tomorrow you will go after some big Northern Pike and fish along some clear water weed beds. What a life this is!
